The books are divided into two sections – fiction and non-fiction. There are many books in the non-fiction part which are helpful in day to day living – especially if you are feeling depressed or sad, or if you need encouragement in your Christian life. There are also a few children's books available now.

In the fiction section, there is a wealth of good Christian novels. Some of us have been buying a number of books by an American writer – Karen Kingsbury. If you enjoy a family saga, then these are for you! Karen writes from the heart and her books are a delight to read. As well as the fourteen books in the family saga series, there are three based on the events of 9/11 and the aftermath of that tragedy, and a number of “stand alone” titles.
