Unfortunately he was soon seized by an attack of cramp. He began calling for help, while fighting a losing battle to stay afloat.

Luckily a farm boy was working in a nearby field. When he heard the frantic cries for help, he jumped in and rescued the English boy.

The father, whose son had been rescued, was of course very grateful. The next day, he went to meet the youth, who had saved his son's life. As they talked, the Englishman asked the Scottish boy, what he planned to do with his future. The boy answered: "Oh I suppose I'll be a farmer like my father". The grateful father said: "Is there something else you'd rather do?" "Oh yes!", answered the Scottish boy. "I've always wanted to be a doctor.
